S Jaishankar's key insights on Pakistan's terrorism tactics, India's global diplomacy

In a an interview with ANI, external affairs minister S Jaishankar has shed light on India's approach to dealing with Pakistan and its global diplomatic strategies under the government. Jaishankar emphasized that India has effectiveneutralized Pakistan's policy of using cross-border terrorism as leverage in diplomatic dialogues. He said, "Pakistan was trying to use cross-border terrorism...we have made that policy irrelevant." Jaishankar highlighted that India is open to dealing with Pakistan but not under conditions where ter-



imate tool for diplomacy. He said, "It's not a case that we won't deal with a neighbour... but it is that we will not deal on the basis of terms that they set where the practice of terrorism is deemed as legitimate and effective in order to bring you to the table." The minister also touched upon the broader aspects of India's foreign policy, particularly in relation to the United States. Discussing US President Joe Biden's inability to visit India for the Republic Day celebrations, Jaishankar revealed that the visit was linked to the pro-

posed Quad Summit and the dates did not align for all partners. "It was tied to Quad Summit...couldn't get everything agreed by everybody," explained. Jaishankar further addressed criticisms about the state of democracy in India, often highlighted in foreign media. He urged a critical view of such narratives, saying, "Don't necessarily take what comes in foreign media at face value." He defended India's democratic credentials, saying that the country meets any standard of democracy, from fair elections to institutional functionality. "I'm not saying we're

perfect. I'm not saying

we don't have room for improvement. Everybody does. We certainly do. But I would say, please look at their motive and their agenda. They are not agenda-less, they are not motive-less, they are trying to push a certain line because they have a certain interest, so don't necessarily take what comes in foreign media at face value...because when you look at the multiple standards that they practice....you are talking of state of democracy in this country, give me any yardstick of democracy. Are your elections fair, is your participation growing. Are broader and broader sections involved, are your institutions working. I would say I am doing as well as any other democracy. Frankly, if anything, I could be passing judgement on whole lot of other,' Jaishankar added.

Following, abusing a woman not offence of outraging modesty: Bombay High Court

NAGPUR: Following, abusing and pushing a woman might be "annoying" acts, but did not constitute the offence of outraging the modesty under IPC Section 354, the Nagpur bench of Bombay HC ruled, and granted relief to a man convicted by the judicial magistrate first class court at Wardha. Justice Anil Pansare acquitted the appellant, a 36year-old labourer, saying the prosecution failed to prove its case beyond reasonable doubt. A college student had filed a police

complaint against the man alleging that he had followed her a couple of times and abused her. Once, when she was going to a market, he followed her on the bicycle and pushed/shoved her, she said in her com-

The magistrate's court convicted the man on May 9, 2016, and sentenced him to two years' rigorous imprisonment. The sessions court upheld the verdict on July 10, 2023. Hearing the man's appeal, the HC said:

Suspecting fidelity, Chhattisgarh man kills wife, 3 children

RAIPUR: A man was arrested by the police for allegedly murdering his wife and three young children over suspicions of his wife's extramarital in Bilaspur, affair Chhattisgarh on Tuesday. According to the superintendent of police, Santosh Singh, the incident took place late Monday night in Hirri village under Masturi police station limits folwhich accused, identified as Umendra Kewat, was arrested. Based on preliminary information, it is reported that Kewat allegedly strangled his wife, along with their two daughters aged 4 and 5, and their 2-yearold son to death due to suspicions surrounding his wife's purported affair, as mentioned by the authorities. The accused faces charges of murder and is currently in custody.

Historic peace deal with **ULFA:** Another feather in Modi's cap

Although it was somewhat long in the offing, the over a decade-long peace dialogue with the United Liberation Front of Asom (ULFA) [Pro-Talk] finally reached a logical conclusion on December 29, 2023, with representatives of the Government of India led by Union Home Minister, Amit Shah, Government of Assam and senior members of the ULFA. Born on the ramparts of an Ahom amphitheatre in Sibsagar on April 7, 1979, the ULFA had been one of the front-ranking insurgent organisations in the Northeast. Indeed, during its heyday, the organisation's clout and firepower had been considerable and was being touted as a serious national security issue that the Indian state had to grapple with. Its chequered history witnessed three important Indian army operations in Assam, namely Operation Bajrang, Operation Rhino-I

Billeted in the hinterland and in all the five outlying countries that made up the strategic encirclement of the Northeast, the organisation had ominous anti-India camps in Bangladesh, Bhutan, China, Nepal and Myanmar. Indeed, the group's anti-talk faction, led by Paresh Barua, continues to have watered-down camps in Myanmar's Sagaing Division. But active military operations and strategies which instituted (a) kinetic action (b) psychological initiatives and (c) developmental imperatives won the day and the organisation was soon careening out of control. Bhutan, at the request of India, mounted an armed operation and broke ULFA's back in the Himalayan kingdom. Its move to Bangladesh was marked by shenanigans by Pakistan's ISI and Khaleda Zia's patronage. But with the return of Sheikh Hasina's Awami League government, the scenario witnessed the handing over of almost the entire Central Committee of the organisation to India. Important leaders of the group, such as its chairman, Arabinda Rajkhowa; Foreign Secretary, Sasadhar Choudhury; Operations Commander, Raju Baruah and a few years later, the outfit's General Secretary, Anup Chetia returned to Assam and soon a benevolent Indian government, recognising that the "boys" were indeed our own, was working out modalities for a peaceful settlement with one of the most important insurgent organisations in South Asia. Certain observers of the historic peace agreement may tend to pooh-pooh the extraordinary effort of New Delhi in its ability to anvil durable peace in Assam. Indeed, it is true that a small but insignificant section led by Paresh Barua continues to stay away from a dialogue process. Of late, there have even been attempts by ULFA (Independent) to make a comeback. Assam and the other seven states of the Northeast have been sagely christened as India's "Ashtha Lakshmi" or the eight personification of the Goddess of Wealth by Narendra Modi. The region is now poised for correct development. Earlier attempts at ethnic resurgences have been industriously addressed by the present government and regional aspirations have joined hands with Modi's national dream. Northeast India and Assam are on the road to developmental vision escape velocity acceleration and take off. On the law and order front, the success story has been no different. Almost all wayward insurgent groups – the Adivasi, Karbi or Dimasa -have been brought back to the mainstream. The dreams and aspirations of their respective parishes have been fulfilled by a sympathetic government. The Assam Police, under able leadership, has

ushered in an era of peace. The situation has to be seen to be believed. Almost all important festivals that were concluded during the last couple of months, be it the Durga Puja, Diwali or the Chhath Puja, were ones of secure festivities and an alert Assam Police did not leave any stone unturned to ensure

that the people of Assam could air their happiness with pomp and gaiety.

2023 has been a good year for Indian foreign policy

When the White House declared that Joe Biden won't be able to meet India's request to attend the Republic Day celebrations on January 26 next year due to 'scheduling issues', India was in a fix. The entire episode was mishandled by the Biden administration that initially let slip the information that such an invite has been made, forcing India to wait on Biden, and the late denial after a period of prolonged suspense — peppered with scepticism over the so-called assassination plot - left New Delhi with a tricky diplomatic problem. India needed someone who may replace Biden in strategic weight and importance for a programme pregnant with symbolism while running the risk of sending an implicit message to the invitee that she/he is a second choice. On December 22, the ministry of external affairs declared in a public notification that French president Emmanuel Macron will visit India as the chief guest for the 75th Republic Day celebrations that also marks the 25th anniversary of the India-France strategic partnership. Prime minister Narendra Modi, incidentally, had attended the Bastille Day parade in Paris as Macron's guest of honour on July 14 this year. The French president promptly responded by posting on X: "Thank you for



your invitation, my dear @NarendraModi. India, on your Republic Day, I'll be here to celebrate with you!" Under the circumstances, to get Macron who has been instrumental in taking bilateral ties to new heights and cementing France's position as one of India's key defence partners and that too at such a short notice implied India's strength, diplomatic clout, growing stature and a favourable geopolitical landscape. In a difficult year grappling with the after-effects of a once-in-a-century pandemic, along with two wars that have thrown Europe and West Asia (Middle East) in turmoil, stretched America's resources, attention and exposed the limits of its leverage, India emerged as the sole "bright spot on a

dark horizon", to quote the IMF. Rating agencies are predicting that India will remain the world's fastest growing major economy for at least the next three years, and reach the world's thirdlargest economy milestone by 2030, if not by 2027, according to some estimates. While India's economic growth is expected to comfortably cruise at around 6.5% in 2023-24, by 2027 it may zoom to 7% led by growth in manufacturing sector even as China's pace dips to below five per cent during the same period. Morgan Stanley says India's GDP is set to double from the current \$3.4 trillion to \$8.5 trillion over the next decade and the country will add more than \$400 billion to its GDP every year, a scale surpassed only by the US and China. This growth is supplemented by stability and key policy monetary policies that have brought down the inflation, which eased to a four-month low in October and a decline in unemployment rate that fell to a six-year low of 3.2% during July 2022-June 2023, according to data released by the National Sample Survey Office. High GDP growth, low inflation, falling unemployment, a scorching surge in stock markets and cooling down of international oil prices has injected incredible optimism in Indian psyche and its economy. India's situation is strikingly different from the depressing mood in Europe where the economy is struggling, and also in the US where the economy is seemingly doing great but has failed to lift the pall of gloom. A Wall Street Journal survey found that 69% of respondents said the "country is headed in the wrong direction. Biden's approval ratings are mired around or below 40%, and approval for his handling of the economy is even lower." In contrast, prime minister Modi remains wildly popular, easily surpassing other global leaders by a mile and recent state elections where BJP recorded handsome victories in three bellwether states may indicate that people are ready to give him one more term. Al is an entirely different ball game from the rest of the modern tech available. In layman's language, Al is a technology that adapts and learns itself from a set of algorithms and data sets provided to it. Modern-day AI is also known as Generative AIit consumes existing data, learns from it, and generates data similar to the original one. This method has time and again proven to infringe several copyrights, trademarks and patents. To understand this, one needs to know that according to Section 2(d)(v) and (vi) of the Copyright Act, an author is a person who causes a computer-generated work to be created. But the point in consideration is whether a person could be linked to the output generated by AI as it is based on a selflearning and adapting model. 

As prices fall, government may lift ban on onion export

NEW DELHI: The government intervention of procuring kharif onion and disposing them of simultaneously have brought down average retail prices by 30% and wholesale prices by 35% in the past one month. Considering the trend of decline in prices and the short shelf life of the summer crop, the government may look at the option of lifting the export ban in a calibrated manner, officials said.

Sources in the onion trade said that they have been informed by government functionaries that the Centre would allow export by government cooperatives. "The government should not have a quota system. They must have



export of onions like other commodities. We are waiting for the notification." Jaydyutt Holkar, director at Mumbai APMC, told. So far, central agencies have procured around 25,000 tonnes of kharif onion from farmers and these have been dis-

posed of simultaneously since these can't be stored. Officials said the ban on export and market interventions have brought the desired result as average retail prices have dropped to Rs 39 per kg this week compared to Rs 59 a month back. Similarly, the average wholesale

prices have also fallen from Rs 4,885 a quintal to Rs 3,137 in the past one month. Traders said that in the last few days, the arrival of fresh kharif onions has increased to 15,000 quintals per day and this needs to be used quickly and export of certain quantities would be a

increased. Bangladesh, Malaysia and Nepal are the main importers of Indian onions. Allowing calibrated exports will also ensure no further fall in prices and ensure farmers get good remuneration. Meanwhile, officials said the government will continue its intervention to keep prices under check. The government has authorised Nafed and NCCF to procure 7 lakh tonne during this fiscal year of which so far 5.3 lakh tonne of onion has been procured.

After US, India second country to send dedicated satellite to study black holes

SRIHARIKOTA: Isro ushered in the New Year with the successful launch of XPoSat (X-ray Polarimeter Satellite), India's first satellite to conduct research on black holes and other celestial objects. Workhorse PSLV placed the satellite on its 60th flight in a 650km orbit. The final stage of PSLV-C58 then turned into an orbital experimental module (POEM) to test the 10 payloads over the next month. Around 22 minutes after the liftoff from Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota, the rocket injected XPoSat. The rocket went through at least two coasting phases -when the engines were not fired -- to place the satellite with a 6-degree inclination. XPoSat will carry out studies of X-rays emitted by celestial objects like black holes, neutron stars and galactic nuclei. It carries two payloads --- Polix (Polarimeter Instrument in X-rays) by Raman Research Institute and Xspect (X-ray spectroscopy and timing) by Space Astronomy Group of URSC. PM Narendra Modi hailed the launch. "A great start to 2024 thanks to our scientists! This launch is wonderful news for the space sector and will enhance India's prowess in this field. Best wishes to our scientists at @isro and the entire space fraternity in taking India to unprecedented heights," Modi tweeted. Isro chairman S Somanath described the launch as a "New Year gift to all of us". "The satellite is unique. It complements the scientific objective we have set for various observations of the universe. It goes with Astrosat and Aditya-L1," Somanath said.

A Raman Research Institute release said XPoSat is only the second x-ray polarimetry mission in the world, after Nasa's Imaging X-ray Polarimetry Explorer (IXPE) launched in 2021. The 10 payloads in the PS4 orbital module include fuel cell power system and Silicon-based high energy cell from Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre, Isro.

On missions planned this year, Somanath called 2024 as the year of Gaganyaan readiness and said the agency targets at least 12-14 missions this year. Meanwhile, Aditya-L1, the spacecraft for India's maiden solar mission, would reach its final destination -- the L1 point of the Sun -- on January 6 when a final manoeuvre would be performed, Isro chief S Somanath said.

Australia stick to winning formula for Warner's farewell Test; Pakistan aim to spoil the party

NEW DELHI: Australia seek to clinch a series sweep against Pakistan in the third and final Test, captain Pat Cummins confirmed that the same winning team from the first two matches would take the field at the Sydney Cricket Ground.



The decision aims to bid farewell to veteran opener David Warner on a high note in his 112th and final Test, following convincing victories in Perth and Melbourne. Cummins, addressing the media on Tuesday, praised Warner as Australia's "greatest three-form player" and emphasized the veteran's significant contributions across formats. "Every time he walks out there, he's competitive, ready to go, so just a champion of Australian sport and hopefully he gets a good send-off this week," Cummins remarked. Warner, who announced his retirement from one-day internationals on Monday, leaves a notable void in the top order for Australia. Cummins did not reveal who would fill the opening position in the upcoming series against West Indies in January but cited Warner's current partner, Usman Khawaja, as an example of a non-specialist who earned his place in the team. On the other side, Pakistan captain Shan Masood faces the challenge of motivating his team after consecutive defeats. Masood acknowledged Australia's dominance but highlighted the positive aspects of Pakistan's performance in Melbourne.

"We have to make sure that we're not making a lot of mistakes to close out games," Masood noted. Masood refrained from naming the playing XI on Tuesday due to some "fitness issues," but spinner Abrar Ahmed is in contention to play his first test of the tour, especially considering the possibility of a turning wicket in Sydney."

Vedanta Resources seeks approval for a proposal to revise the terms of its dollar bonds to cut its debt load. The miner is offering to pay \$779 million for notes due this year and 2025, and plans to extend the maturity on the remaining principal. S&P Global cut Vedanta's rating to CC and expects good earnings and strong cash flows. Bondholders are recommended to give their consent for the amendments, but S&P Global is skeptical about the lack of adequate compensation for the extension of maturities. Vedanta's ability to honor its \$1 billion bond



due January 21 is in question. Vedanta Resources Ltd faces a moment of reckoning this week as Indian billionaire Anil Agarwal's miner seeks approval for a proposal that could help it buy more time to honor its debt liabilities.

Bondholders have until Jan. 2 to give an early consent on a plan to push out due dates on \$3.2 billion in bond repayments, a move that prompted S&P Global

Ratings in December to cut the company's rating deeper into junk. Vedanta needs a green light from at least twothirds of the bondholders in each of the three securities to proceed with the plan.

A holder meeting will be held on January 4. The bid to revise the terms of its dollar bonds marks the latest attempt by Agarwal's group to bolster its balance sheet, having already sold a stake in its Mumbai-listed subsidiary and secured a \$1.25 billion private loan. RBI draws up checklist for AI tech in banking

MUMBAI: RBI deputy governor Rajeshwar Rao has raised concerns over issue relating to fairness, transparency and governance in the use of artificial intelligence in banking.

Speaking at at the 106th annual conference of Indian Economic Association in Delhi last week, Rao said that despite the transformative potential of GenAI, there are potential impacts on productivity, jobs, and income distribution.

While proponents expect widespread economic and societal benefits, sceptics point to concerns such as increased unemployment and challenges in resource reallocation during the transition. Rao outlined specific concerns and expectations for financial institutions deploying AI in their processes and decision-making. These include biases, robustness issues, data privacy, cybersecurity, consumer protection, and maintaining financial stability. He added that AI inherits biases and errors from its training data, making regular fairness audits essential. He highlighted the challenge of AI models being black boxes, making them difficult to decode for audit and supervisory reviews. "Al may also pose some novel challenges for governance, especially where the technology is used to facilitate autonomous decisionmaking and may limit or even potentially eliminate human judgement and oversight," said Rao. He outlined ten aspects for financial institutions deploying AI models, aiming to balance innovation and responsible technology use. These include fairness, transparency, accuracy, consistency, data privacy, explainability, accountability, robustness, monitoring, updating, and human oversight.

NEW DELHI: Powered by SUVs, the car industry crossed the psychological 4-million mark for the first time in 2023, growing by 8% during the year. Companies, however, expect "flat to moderate" growth curve in the new year as concerns around interest rates and the end of pent-up demand are likely to slow down new purchases. The industry, which was under pressure after Covid-induced lockdowns were announced around March of 2020, had experienced a massive turnaround when markets opened up again. The pandemic also gave a boost to personal mobility.While shortage of



semiconductors had dampened production for most parts of the Covid period - leading to huge waiting periods across many models from companies such as Mahindra & Mahindra, Maruti, Hyundai, Kia and Tata Motors - the gradual improvement in supplies has now seen most of the backlog getting cleared.

The industry, however, feels that going in the new year may not be as strong as in the previous years as the sales-base is now bigger, and backlogs are gone. "Going by the current analysis, it looks like growth would be muted and in single digits," Shashank Srivastava, senior executive officer (sales & marketing) at Maruti Suzuki,

The good part for the industry is that the average selling price for vehicles has gone up to around Rs 11.5 lakh in 2023, against Rs 10.6 lakh last year, and Rs 8.2 lakh at the end of fiscal 2019-20. Talking about the reasons for the surge, Srivastava listed out the growing desire of buyers to opt for feature-rich vehicles, the rising share of SUVs, and the spike in retail prices.

UPI payments rise 42% to 18L cr in December



MUMBAI: UPI transaction value went up 42% yearon-year to Rs 18 lakh crore in December, while volume rose 54% to 1,202 crore. The growth in UPI transaction volume stood at 7% when compared to the previous month. Average daily transactions under UPI touched 40 crore against the targeted 100 crore in three years by NPCI earlier this year. The volume of Fastag transactions touched 34.8 crore in December, up 13% yearon-year. The value of the transactions rose 19% to Rs 5,861 crore over the same period, and 10% higher than the Rs 5,539 crore recorded November 2023 as Indians took to the road in record numbers during Christmas vacation.
